

Warwickshire Geological Conservation Group (WGCG)
Local Geological Sites - LoGS 49 River Arrow, Studley Update, 11 Aug 2016

- An active river system with unvegetated banks, active erosion, shingle banks, terraces and paleochannels
 - Easy access to the site from the lane adjacent to St. Mary's Parish Church.
 - A public footpath crosses the meadows on the east side of the river but access should be checked with Mr.Green, the landowner, as the riverbank is not on the footpath itself.
 - Mr. Green is happy for the site to be inspected.
 - There are no physical restrictions to access and no interpretation boards.
- At the northern end of the site the riverbanks are free of vegetation and all the described features of the migrating channel and the bank deposits are fully visible.
- The banks further down are more vegetated.
 - There is no evidence of dumping, landfill, vandalism or other detrimental effects.
 - The site is not degrading but is evolving naturally; cattle graze the adjacent meadows and freely cross the river at low points in the banks but do not appear to be causing a problem.
