

Warwickshire Geological Conservation Group (WGCG)
Local Geological Site - LGS 60 Round Hill Road Cutting, Update 24 Oct 2018

Brief Description:

- This road cutting formerly exposed Mercia Mudstone Group Blue Anchor Formation, Cotham Member and Wilmcote Limestone, with interesting microfossil assemblages.

Monitoring Report:

- No permission is required to observe this site as it is roadside on the B4089 between Wootton Wawen and Little Alne.
- Parking is possible on a wide grassy stretch opposite and just beyond the site.
- There are no physical obstacles to viewing the site.
- There are no fences visible and no interpretation boards.
- Photographs were taken in the NE and NW directions.
- Care must be taken as the road may be busy and there is a blind bend and crest just before the site.
- The site is totally overgrown with fairly mature trees, undergrowth and ground cover. There is no longer any rock exposed.
- There is no risk of flooding, no dumping or landfill was evident, no quarrying or engineering work, no agricultural activity, river management or ground stabilisation.
- It is possible that the maturing trees will influence the underlying rock.
- The site could be re-exposed if permission is granted but this would be a substantial task requiring machinery and skilled labour.
