

**Warwickshire Geological Conservation Group (WGCG)
Local Geological Site - LGS 69 Marlcliff Update 24 Oct 2018**

- Exposure of a sequence through the Triassic Mercia Mudstone Group, Blue Anchor Formation up into the Westbury Formation of the Penarth Group.
- No permission is required to visit this site as it exists as a cliff alongside the Avon Valley Footpath.
- Parking is available at the end of a rough track that runs down from the village to the riverside.
- The site is immediately adjacent to the parking spot.
- There are no physical obstacles to viewing the site but climbing into the site vegetation is difficult.
- There are no fences, gates or interpretation boards.
- The site is totally overgrown with mature trees, undergrowth and ground cover. It is difficult to see whether any rock is exposed.
- It looks as though some talus or debris has accumulated at the base of the cliff.
- Although the site is on the banks of the Avon it is probably too high to suffer any damage from flooding.
- There is no evidence of dumping, landfill, quarrying, engineering, agriculture or other activity.
- The cliff could be re-exposed but with a considerable effort using machinery and skilled labour.
