

Warwickshire Geological Conservation Group (WGCG)
Local Geological Site - LGS 88 Edge Hill Farm Quarry Update, 1 May 2019

- Exposures of the lowest few metres of the Marlstone Rock Formation above its basal pebble bed. Periglacial shattering of the top 1.5m and excellent profile of a ferruginous brown earth soil.
- Although the site lies adjacent to the Centenary Way and is highly accessible to groups, the space for car parking is limited if approached from Edge Hill itself. Permission should be sought from the farm if a large group plans to park there.
- Alternatively approach can be made from the car park of the Castle Inn and a pleasant ½ mile walk along the Centenary Way.
- A number of exposures are readily visible over a distance of about 20 metres along the path.
- The area around the exposures is now wooded with mature (albeit dying) ash trees and some shrub, vegetation, nettles and goosegrass. None the less the exposures are mostly free from vegetation and can be approached with care.
- There are no interpretation boards.
- There is no evidence of dumping or vandalism but there is a limited amount of talus building up at one exposure and the potential for deterioration due to the effect of the tree roots.

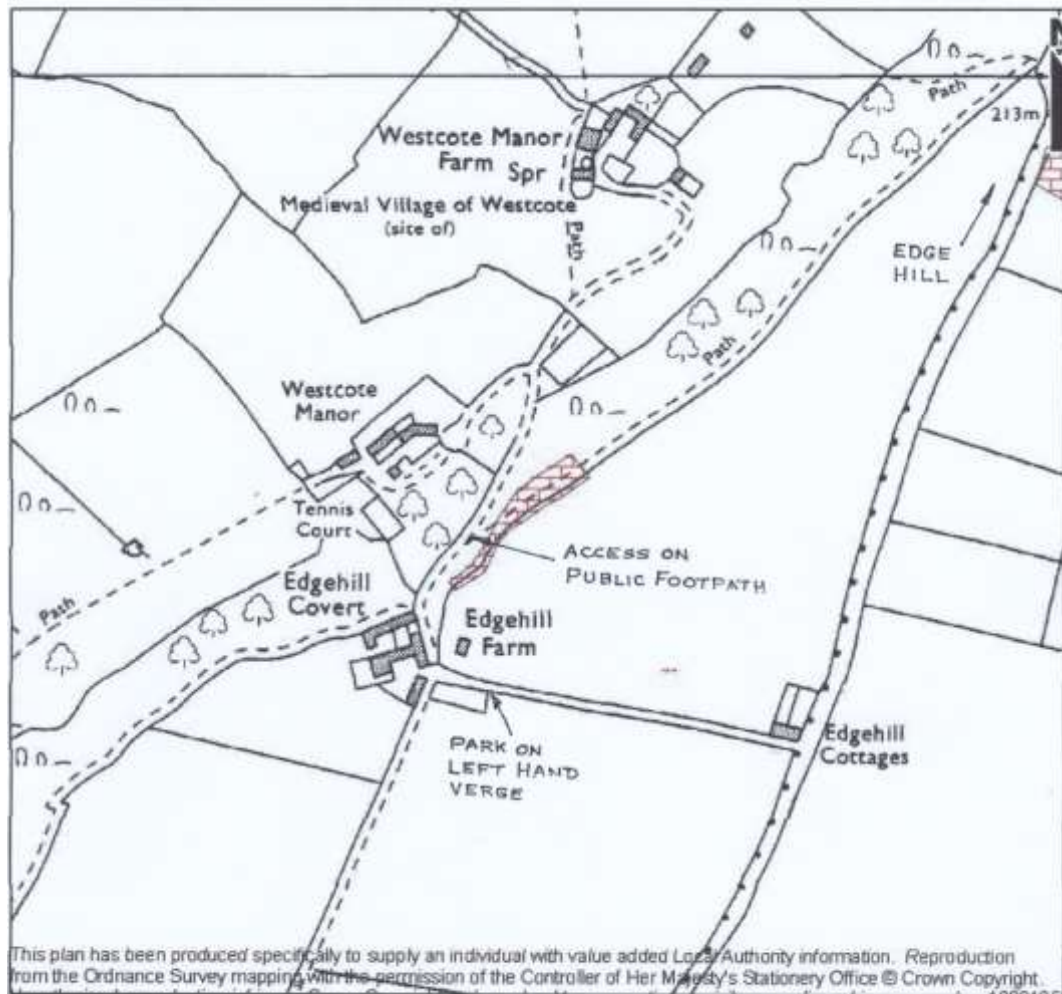
