## Location

The site is located immediately above Napton Industrial Estate and is accessed via the public footpath which runs north-eastward from the brickyard road up to Napton Windmill.

## **Summary of Interest**

This site contains a collecion of very large sandstone nodules referred to as "doggers" which were excavated from the Dyrham Formation in the former Napton Brickworks Quarry (photo. evidence at Warwick Museum). The nodules display a variety of sedimentary structures and contain some fossil shells.
