
Warwickshire Geological Conservation Group (WGCG) Local Geological Site - LGS 91 Cherry Orchard Brick Pit, Update Oct 2016


Brief Description:

A rare section in the Ashow Formation of the Permian Warwickshire Group. During the restoration of the former brickworks, a section in the mudstones, some 6m deep was preserved. This is believed to correlate with the lower part of the formation. The mudstones are red-brown in colour and frequently display green reduction spots.

Monitoring Report:

- This site is next to the re-cycling unit in Kenilworth. It is in a field which has been used for hay this year.
- The monitor approached WCC for permission to go to the site and was told that the field was leased to a farmer and he should approach him. On asking for contact details he was told that he could not have them "for data protection reasons".
- Our site map is very out of date. If you look on Google maps at Pipers Lane, Kenilworth, you will see the lane to the "Wks" on the site map is now Pipers Lane with houses and the Recycling shop. In the field, which is on a land fill site, you can see many paths. These are where the people undertaking land fill monitoring go to inspect the many monitoring vents.
- On our site map it looks as if there is an entrance into the field where Adcock Drive meets Willow Meer. There may have been in the past but it is severely boarded up now. However, it is very easy to enter by the Recycling Centre.
- Where LGS 91 is indicated on our map is completely over grown.
