
Location

The site(s) comprises two sections of the former cement quarry, now flooded and administered as a nature reserve by the Warks. Wildlife Trust. Access to the quarry is via public footpaths although the in situ section can only be reached by boat. The spoil material which could form a valuable 'fossil hunting area' is adjacent to the footpath which runs around the lake.

Summary of Interest

A former cement quarry within the Rugby Limestone Member of the Lower Jurassic Blue Lias Formation. Though the exposures are flooded & inaccessible, the faces allow a clear appreciation of the Rugby Limestone succession of alternating mudstones and limestones, variously attributed to primary (sedimentological) and secondary (diagenetic) processes. *Ex situ* clay and limestone debris, accessible on site, has yielded a number of typical Rugby Limestone fossils including oysters (*Gryphaea*) and crinoid ossicles.
